1. Depressurize the machine before disconnecting any hoses.
2. Do not check for oil leaks with your bare hands since high-pressure oil is invisible and can cause serious injury. **ALWAYS** use cardboard or wood pieces to assist your inspection



WARNING

Be careful about exhaust gas.

1. Use the machine in a ventilated area.
2. Make sure the room is ventilated especially when using the machine indoor.

* Failure to observe this precaution can result personal injuries.



WARNING

Do not touch with your bare hands.

1. Following by rapid raise of the oil temperature, the temperature of the machine goes up while and after the operation. **DO NOT** touch the machine with your bare hands.
2. The temperature of tools will also raise while or after the operating. **BE SURE** that you always wear protective tool while using tools.

INTRODUCTION

1. This hydraulic power unit is a power source only designed to supply hydraulic oil for working the following handheld tools:
 - (1) Hydraulic Handheld Breakers: BH053, BH7E, BH112, BH163, BH18K, BH23K, BH20EV, BH23K28A, BH23K28AV, BH23K32EV
 - (2) Hydraulic Pile Drivers: KH240V, KH192
 - (3) Hydraulic Rock Drills: DH204, DH205
 - (4) Hydraulic Concrete Cutter: CH130, CH140
 - (5) Hydraulic Handheld Earth Drill: OH1, AY01H
 - (6) Hydraulic Water Pump: PH300

2. **DO NOT** operate the power unit in the following situations:
 - (1) Close by inflammable objects or objects which can catch fire easily. Especially when refueling gasoline.
 - (2) Use the power unit on slopes.
 - (3) Underground, or any places which are not well-ventilated.
 - (4) At high altitudes which exceeds 1,000 m
(*Ask Maruzen dealer if you intend to use the power units on high altitudes)
 - (5) Use the power unit in explosive environment.
 - (6) Use the power unit for purposes other than stated in this manual.

GUIDELINES

1. Always wear protective equipment such as helmet, goggles, boots, gloves, ear protection and dust mask.
2. Do not use this power unit on slops.
3. Make sure that dirt or dust does not get into hoses while connecting and disconnecting.
4. Make sure to lock couplers and check out whether there is damage when connecting with them.
5. Warm up the engine before using if the temperature is below 10°C
Working temperature range : -10°C ~ 40°C
6. Keep fire and flammable material away from working space.
7. Anything related to engine, such as adjustments, storage and etc., refer to Honda Engine owner's manual for more information.
8. Be cautious about not to damage the electric wirings, or getting wet by water.
9. Make sure whether the pressure resistance of the hose is appropriate. In case of sudden hydraulic hose breakage or hydraulic oil blow out of the hose. **STOP** the power unit **IMMEDIATELY**.
10. After disconnecting attachments (breakers, etc.) from the power unit, make sure all the couplers are capped to prevent dirt or dust getting inside.
11. When connecting or disconnecting hoses, a small amount of hydraulic oil might drip down. Make sure that surrounding area does not get dirty by oil. Refill the hydraulic oil if necessary.

12. Drain gasoline if you intend to store the power unit for more than 1 month. (Drain gasoline from the tank. To make sure all gasoline has been drained completely, run the engine until it automatically stops.)

13. When intend to use the power unit after a long term storage, make sure the gasoline tank is full-filled. If the tank is not full-filled, the air which remained inside fuel hose will disturb oil flow and cause it difficult to start the engine.

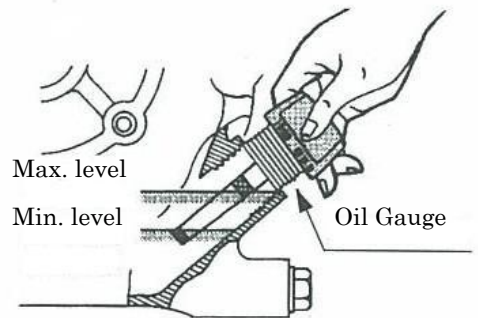
14. Hydraulic power units can be stored in 3 tiers under the following conditions:
 1. Must be stored on a flat space.
 2. Rubber feet must be put into the attachments on power unit.
(Refer to the drawing next page)
 3. A block must be put under the lowest power unit.
(Refer to the drawing next page)

OPERATION

1. Pre-starting Inspection:

- (1) Engine Oil:
Check the engine oil level by oil gauge. Refill engine oil when the oil is below the min. level.

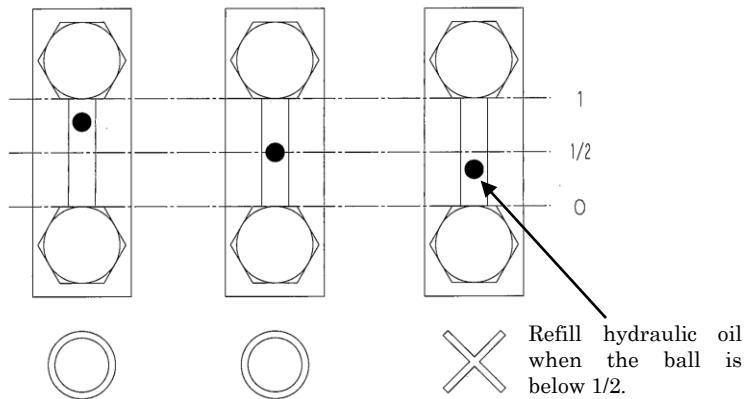
Recommended engine oil:
SAE 10W-30 or equivalent.
Capacity: 0.6L



- (2) Hydraulic Oil:
Refill hydraulic oil when the oil level is below 1/2 of the oil indication window. Open the plug on the top of the oil tank, fill in hydraulic oil until the oil level reach to the middle of the indication window.

Recommended hydraulic oil: **ISO VG32** or equivalent.

Capacity: 4L



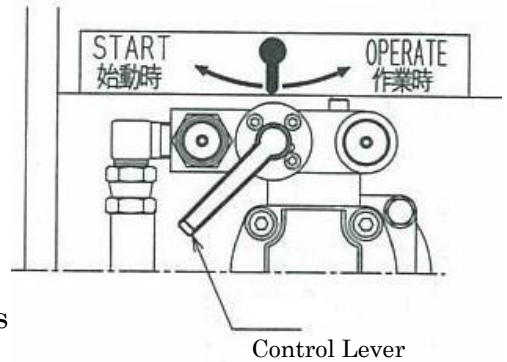
- (3) Fuel:
Refill gasoline into the fuel tank.
Capacity: 3.1L
Do not forget to close the cap.

* Wipe off spilled gasoline on the power unit.
Keep fire and flammable material away from working space.

- (4) Unlock the latch on breaker, insert a tool, and lock the latch.

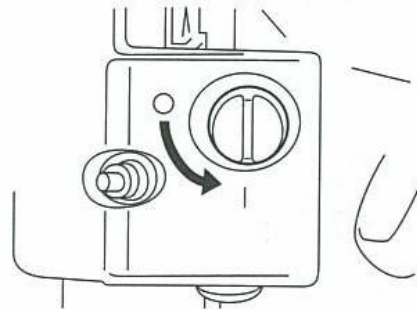
2. Starting Engine:

- (1) Attach the power unit and the tool (breakers and etc.) with connection hoses before starting engine.
Make sure to lock couplers.
DO NOT start engine without connecting to tool with hoses.
MAKE SURE control lever is set at "START" position.

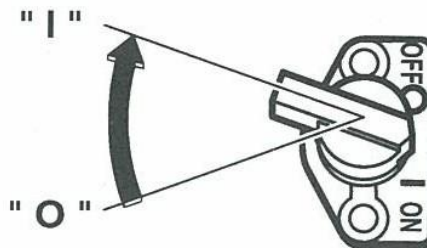


- (2) Start operation

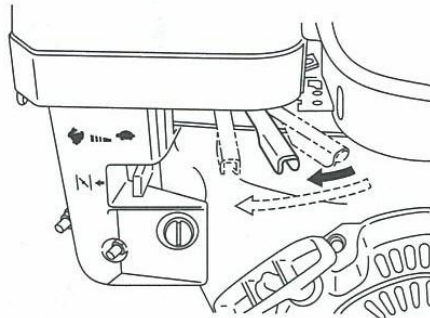
- ① Open the fuel cock.



- ② Turn the switch to "ON"



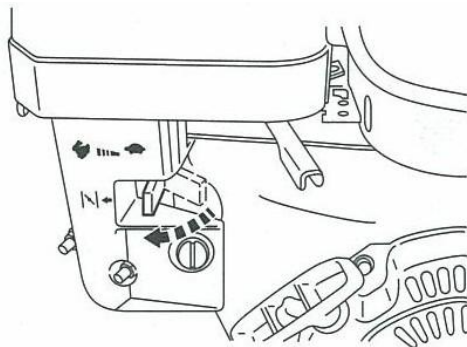
- ③ Turn the speed control lever from low speed (L) toward to high speed (H) and stop at 1/3 closer to (H) position.



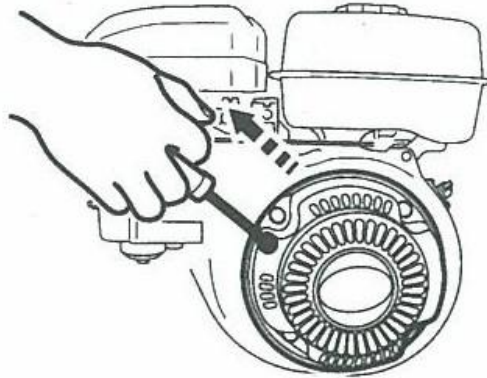
- ④ Close the choke lever.

When to open the choke lever:

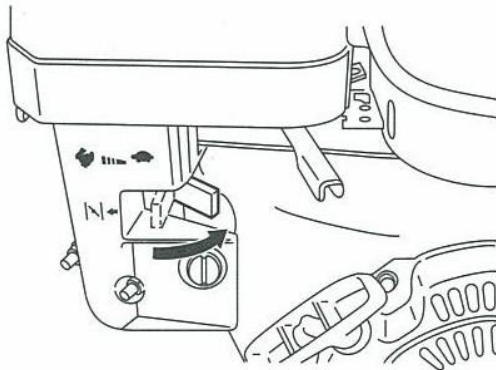
- When the temperature is low or when the engine is cold, close the choke lever.
- When the temperature is warm or when starting the engine right after stopping, fully or partially open the choke lever.



- ⑤ Pull start rope gradually. **DO NOT** pull the starting rope quickly. After the rope being fully pulled, **DO NOT** release it from your hand. Hold the starting rope until it returns to its original position.



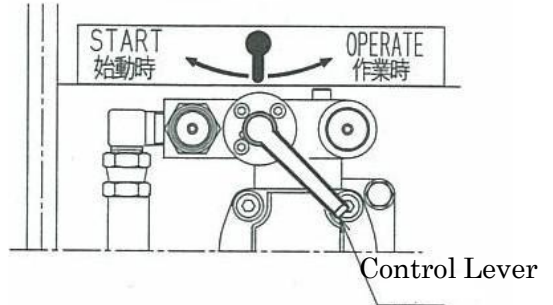
- ⑥ After the engine being started, open the choke lever.
- Open the choke lever gradually according to the engine's condition. Eventually, the choke lever should be fully opened.
 - When the weather is cold, engine might stop if you turn the choke lever too rapidly.



3. Operation:

(1) Turn the throttle to high speed (H)

(2) Turn the control lever to the “OPERATE” position.
(Refer to the drawing on the right)

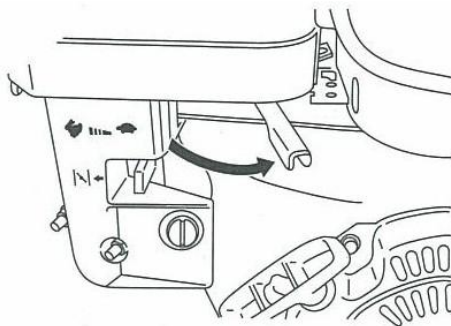


(3) Read through all operating manuals of tools which you intend to use with this power unit.

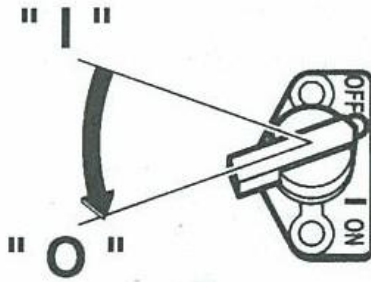
(4) When stopping the operation of the tool (breakers and etc) ALWAYS turn the engine throttle to the Low Speed (L) side. This can save energy and reduce the noise level.

4. Stoppage:

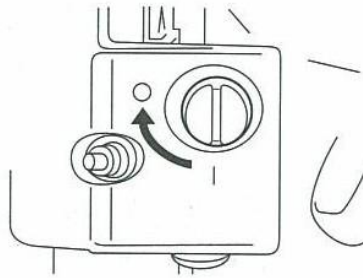
(1) Turn the speed control lever to Low Speed (L) side and run the machine for 1 to 2 minutes.



- (2) Turn the switch to “O” Off side.
IMPORTANT When emergency happened and need to stop the power unit immediately, turn off this switch.



- (3) Turn off the fuel cock.



- (4) Detach connection hoses from tool (breakers and etc).
Connect couplers on the hoses together.

⚠ CAUTION

The temperature of the machine goes high while being operated. Always wear gloves when operating the tools (breakers and etc,) and be attentive for the heat on the tools (breakers and etc), hoses and power unit.

MAINTANANCE

I. Daily Inspections

- (1) Make sure the power unit is OFF when inspecting to avoid unexpected movement.
- (2) Check the engine oil level each time by oil gauge before starting the engine.
- (3) Make sure hydraulic oil is above the middle line on the indicator window. Refill hydraulic oil if necessary.
(Recommended Hydraulic Oil: ISO VG32 or equivalent)
- (4) Clean the element of the air cleaner in the engine.
- (5) Make sure there is no oil leakage from the pump and hoses. Tighten up the hose joints and bolts if necessary.
- (6) Start the engine, run at low speed (Idling) and make sure there is no abnormal sound and movement.

*For further information, ask Maruzen dealer.

II. Periodically Inspections

For the purpose of keeping the power unit in a good condition, make sure the following maintenance are done periodically.

Ask your dealer for the periodical inspections and replacement parts.

1. Make sure to always wear protective equipment when refueling gasoline and oil, and replacing parts.
2. Make sure to work after stop working and temperature drops enough.
3. Do not close fire such as cigarette when handling gasoline.
4. Drain hydraulic oil from the drain plug at the bottom of the oil tank.
Replace hydraulic oil when the color of hydraulic oil changed to yellow to brown or when it smells burning. Always use the same type of hydraulic oil.
5. Suction filter should be cleaned by non-lead gasoline.
6. Clean oil cooler.
7. Inspect the hoses which connected to breaker thoroughly.
Replace a new one if there are scratches, damages which may cause oil leak.

TOOL DISPOSAL

- To dispose of the machinery, shall be performed in accordance with the national, or local laws, ordinances, rules, and standards.
- Do not disposal with fuel left in the power unit.
Make sure to run out gasoline by working before disposal.
- Dispose hydraulic oil of according to the oil manufacturer's instructions.

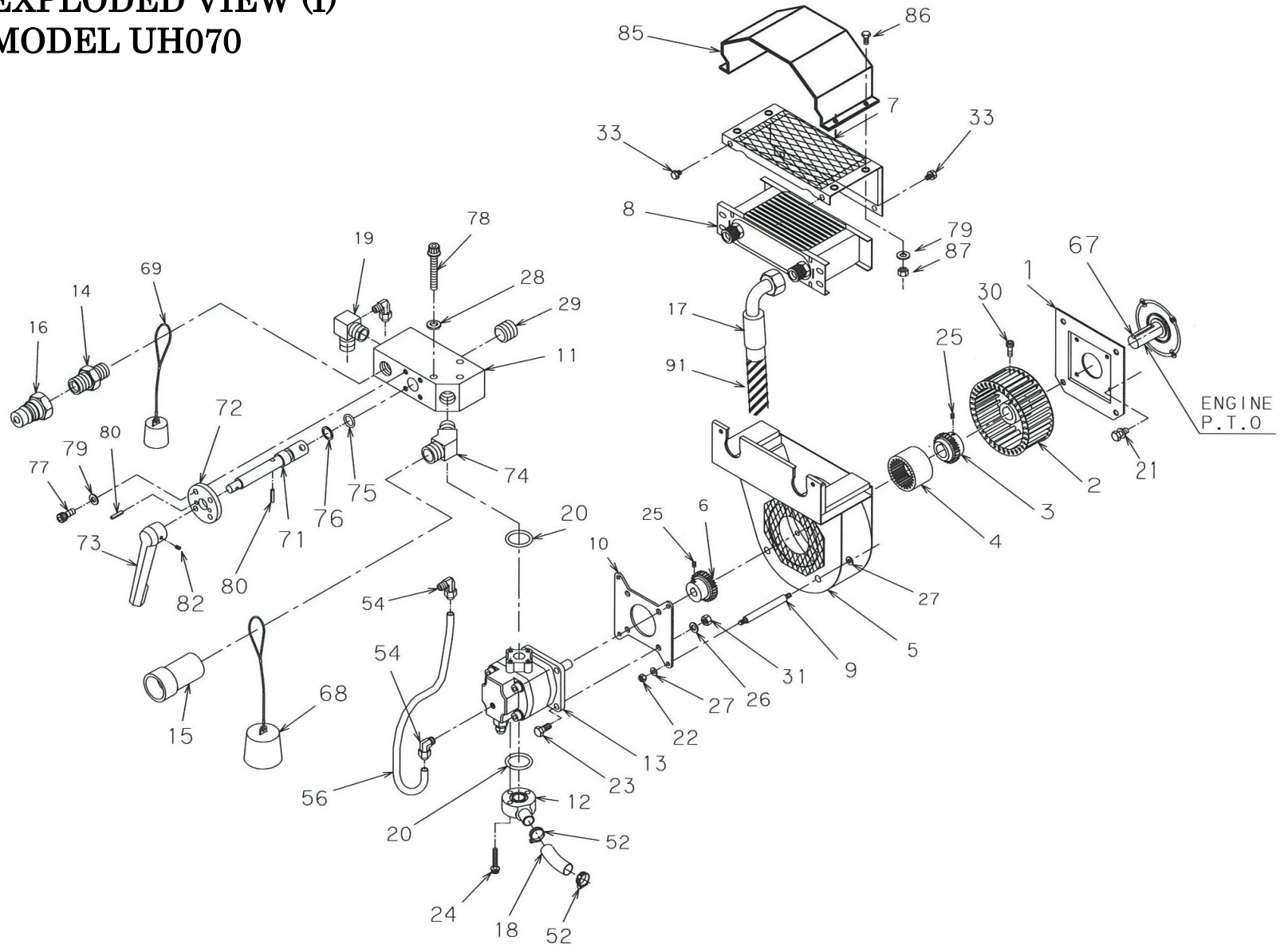

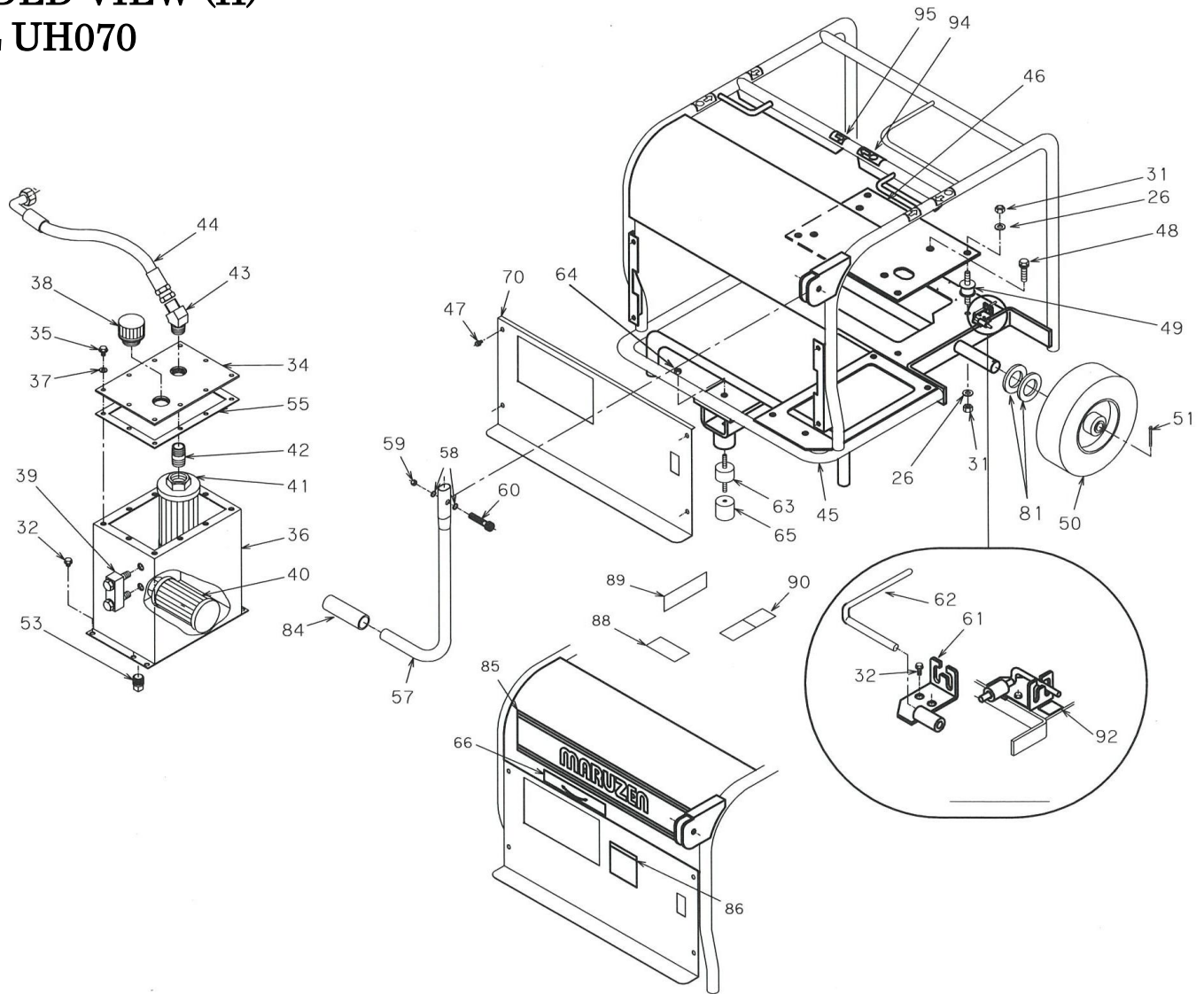
